INFORMATION ABOUT FEDERAL JURY SERVICE

Welcome to jury service in the United States District Court for the Western District of Wisconsin. When you report to the courthouse you will receive information explaining our duties and responsibilities as a federal juror. This information will answer questions of a more immediate nature. We hope you will find your service as a juror an interesting and rewarding experience.

The Clerk's Office does not have permanent staff in Eau Claire. Please direct all questions and correspondence to the Clerk's Office in Madison. The contact information is listed on page 2.

LOCATION

The U.S. Courthouse is located at 500 South Barstow in Eau Claire, between Gray Street and East Lake Street.

TERM OF SERVICE

The term of service is three months. You are "on call" for this period. During this time, our office will call you via an automated phone message to notify you of the specific date on which you must report. This phone call will be made the Tuesday prior to your report date. Our office will also send you a written notice to appear identifying the specific date to report. The notice will be mailed to your home one week in advance of the date you need to report. If you are not selected to serve on your first trial, you may be called back during this three-month period.

CHANGE OF NAME, ADDRESS OR TELEPHONE NUMBER

You will receive phone messages from our automated calling system regarding jury service. Please make sure that we have a current home phone number where we may leave messages regarding jury service. It is also important that we have your correct address so you will receive all written notices and your payment for jury service. The U.S. Post Office cannot forward jury checks.

REPORTING FOR SERVICE

Report to Room 20, the Jury Assembly Room, on the second floor of the courthouse. It is important that you report on time because the orientation session will start promptly at 8:30 a.m.

Jury selections are scheduled on Mondays. Typically the trial will begin on the same day as jury selection. Most of our trials last three to four days. Usually trials begin at 9:00 a.m. and last until 6:00 p.m. There will be a one-hour recess for lunch. You will be on your own for lunch. There are restaurants within easy walking distance of the courthouse. If you travel a significant distance to the courthouse, you should be prepared to stay overnight in the Eau Claire area if a lengthy trial makes round trip travel inappropriate.

PARKING

There is no reserved parking available for jurors on the small courthouse lot. The Civic Center Parking Ramp is 2 ½ blocks from the courthouse. The parking ramp is located next to the Ramada Inn Convention Center, which is #22 on the enclosed map. The maximum the court will reimburse jurors for parking is \$7.00 per day. Jurors should not park at parking meters. Jurors are responsible for any parking violation notices.

JURY SELECTION

Names of prospective jurors are randomly selected from the State of Wisconsin list of actual voters in the most recent presidential election. The names of prospective jurors for trials to be held in Eau Claire were selected from thirty-six of the counties in the Western District of Wisconsin. Our office mailed a questionnaire form to those selected to be completed and returned to the court. After the court determined those qualified to serve, names were randomly selected.

PAYMENT OF ATTENDANCE FEES AND TRANSPORTATION COSTS

As a federal juror, you will receive \$40.00 for each day you report for jury service. Full-time, part-time or temporary employees of the federal government, excluding postal employees, who serve as jurors in federal court are not entitled to attendance fees unless you are in a non-pay status during all or part of your jury service. You will be reimbursed 44 ½ cents per mile round trip from your home to the courthouse. Please be prepared to report this one-way mileage. If you have to stay overnight to be in Eau Claire by court time, you will be paid an additional subsistence fee.

FAILURE TO REPORT

Jurors who fail to report for jury duty and who have not been excused by the Court may be served a Show Cause Order by a United States Deputy Marshal. Those jurors will be ordered to appear before a federal judge to show cause why they should not be held in contempt of the Jury Selection Act. Contempt penalties range from a \$100.00 fine to three days imprisonment, or both. Title 28 United States Code Section 1866(g).

REQUESTS FOR EXCUSE

If serving on a jury for the three month period for which you are summoned would result in an undue hardship for you, you may request to be deferred to a later three-month period. You need to submit this information **immediately**. If you have a vacation scheduled during that period you must provide documentation (itinerary from travel agent, hotel/flight reservations) with your request. Our office will submit the request to the court and notify you of the judge's reply to your request to be excused.

CERTIFICATE OF ATTENDANCE

Upon request the jury clerk will provide a certificate of attendance showing the date of service. Your employer may request this certificate.
