Defendant Angela Giddley has written to the court to ask for the appointment of counsel to represent her on appeal, saying that she wishes to allege ineffectiveness of counsel, threats to induce her guilty plea and her medical condition. Defendant was sentenced in this court in December 2002. Her time for appealing ran 60 days later. The record does not show that defendant filed a notice of appeal during that time, which means that she has lost her chance to appeal.

If defendant believes that she was denied an opportunity to take a timely appeal, she can file a motion pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2255, setting forth the reasons for her belief and the issues she would have raised had she been able to appeal. If defendant chooses this option, she should write to the clerk of court to request a form for filing a § 2255 motion.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that defendant Angela Giddley's motion for appointment of counsel to represent her on appeal is DENIED.
