ORDER

Plaintiff Eugene Cherry has filed a motion for summary judgment with supporting papers. In a separate motion accompanying the motion for summary judgment, he asks that the court photocopy his submission and serve it on Douglas Knott, counsel for defendants Bartels and McQuillan. He notes that although he sent a copy of his motion and supporting papers to Assistant Attorney General Corey Finkelmeyer, counsel for the other defendants in this case, he does not have enough paper to copy his submission by hand for Mr. Knott or the money to pay for photocopies. He states that when he requested an extension of his legal loan privilege to photocopy the documents for Mr. Knott, the request was denied on

the ground that he is capable of hand copying them. Plaintiff's motion that the court copy and serve his motion on Mr. Knott will be denied.

According to the preliminary pretrial conference order entered in this case on December 11, 2002, the deadline for filing dispositive motions is April 28, 2003. Plaintiff has more than enough time to save up paper or money that will allow him to make a copy of his motion and supporting documents for Mr. Knott. Until he has served Mr. Knott with the motion and accompanying documents, the motion will not be considered.

#### ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that plaintiff's motion that the court copy and serve his motion for summary judgment and supporting papers on counsel for defendants Bartels and McQuillan is DENIED. Further, IT IS ORDERED that the court will take no action on plaintiff's motion for summary judgment until plaintiff notifies the court that he has served a copy of the motion and supporting papers on Mr. Knott.
