ORDER

Jeffrey D. Zimmerman has written to the court to ask for an extension of time in which defendant David H. Tedder and Rebecca Tedder, an interested party, can oppose the government's motion for a stay. He alleges that he did not learn of the briefing schedule on the motion until today, although the brief is due on March 8 because the schedule was served on a "Peter Goldberg," rather than on him.

Defendant has a number of lawyers, who appear to play various roles in his defense, his appeal and his forfeiture proceedings. Mr. Zimmerman has never filed a notice of appearance in this case, which makes it difficult for the court to serve him with the papers he wishes to have. So far as the court's records show, he is not even a member of the bar of this court.

Nevertheless, I will grant the extension of time he has requested, on the condition that he file an immediate notice of appearance and apply for permission to appear in this case, which will be the filing that will alert the clerk's office to the need to send mailings to him.

Counsel for Michael Haden, an interested party, has filed for a similar extension of time, again on the ground that he did not receive the briefing schedule until today. His motion will be granted as well.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that the motions of David Tedder and interested parties Rebecca Tedder and Michael Haden for an extension of time until March 15, 2004, to oppose the government's motion for a stay are GRANTED. Mr. Zimmerman is to file a formal notice of appearance and request for permission to appear in this case immediately.
