Plaintiff James H. White has filed objections to the report and recommendation entered by the United States Magistrate Judge on February 23, 2004. The magistrate judge recommended affirmance of the defendant commissioner's denial of plaintiff's application for disability insurance benefits and supplemental security income under the Social Security Act. Plaintiff contends that the recommendation is flawed because it rests upon an erroneous decision by the administrative law judge who heard his case.

After reviewing the report, the record, the parties' briefs and plaintiff's objections, I am persuaded that the magistrate judge's recommendation is well-founded. The magistrate judge considered all of the arguments that plaintiff has marshaled in his favor and, in a

comprehensive report, explained why they do not support reversal of defendant's decision to deny benefits to plaintiff. No purpose would be served in adding to the explanation.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that the United States Magistrate Judge's recommendation to affirm the decision of the defendant Commissioner is ADOPTED; FURTHER, IT IS ORDERED that the defendant Commissioner's decision denying plaintiff James H. White's application for disability insurance benefits and supplemental security income is AFFIRMED.
