ORDER

04-CR-0027-C-01

Defendant Amin Williams has filed a motion with the court seeking to be transferred to the custody of the Bureau of Prisons to continue serving his state and federal sentences. Although the State of Wisconsin has indicated it has no objection to the transfer to federal custody, it remains the decision of the Bureau of Prisons to determine whether to accept custody in this case. Apparently, the bureau has declined to take custody of defendant until he completes service of his state sentence.

There is no legal requirement that the Bureau of Prisons take custody of defendant before he completes the service of his state court sentences. Therefore, this court has no authority to grant defendant the relief he is seeking. Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED that

defendant Amin Williams's motion for a transfer to the custody of the federal Bureau of Prisons is DENIED.
