On September 22, 2005, the parties filed a joint motion to extend the summary judgment motion deadline from October 21, 2005 to November 21, 2005. The court declines to accept the stipulation and the original deadline remains in effect.

This is a simple Fair Credit Reporting Act case that plaintiff filed over seven months ago. As the parties learned at the April 27, 2005 preliminary pretrial conference, this court moves its cases quickly and the parties must keep pace. The court requires summary judgment motions to be fully briefed three months before trial so that it has time to rule on them. Because trial in this case is set for February 21, 2006, and because summary judgment briefing takes 31 days, the October 21, 2005 motion deadline is at the edge of the court's scheduling envelope. The parties have presented no reasons why they have been unable to obtain the necessary discovery or to prepare adequately for summary judgment in the time allotted. Therefore, the summary judgment motion deadline stands.
