In this civil action for injunctive, declaratory and monetary relief, plaintiff Anthony

D. Turner contends that defendants violated his rights under the Eighth Amendment when
defendant Mickelson sexually assaulted plaintiff during a pat search and defendants Esser
and Huibregtse failed to prevent the sexual assault.

In an order dated October 24, 2005, I granted plaintiff leave to proceed against defendants Huibregtse, Esser and Mickelson. This case is before the court on defendants' motion to dismiss pursuant to Fed. R. Civ. P. 12(b)(6), which was filed on November 30, 2005. On January 4, 2006, Magistrate Judge Crocker issued a Preliminary Pretrial Conference Order, advising plaintiff that he had until January 11, 2006, to respond to

 $defendants' \, motion \, to \, dismiss. \,\, Plaintiff \, has \, not \, responded \, to \, defendants' \, motion \, to \, dismiss.$ 

His silence may mean he is no longer interested in prosecuting this case. Therefore, I will

give plaintiff two weeks in which to file and serve a statement advising the court whether he

opposes defendants' motion to dismiss and intends to continue to prosecute this case. If

plaintiff does not advise the court and opposing counsel within two weeks of his intent to

prosecute this case I will dismiss the case without prejudice.

**ORDER** 

IT IS ORDERED that plaintiff Anthony D. Turner may have until February 24,

2006, in which to file and serve a statement advising the court and opposing counsel

whether he opposes defendants' motion to dismiss and remains interested in prosecuting this

case. If, by February 24, 2006, plaintiff fails to respond to this order, the clerk of court is

directed to enter judgment dismissing this case without prejudice for plaintiff's failure to

prosecute.
