Claimant Allen L. Oleson's second motion to stay proceedings in this civil forfeiture action pending resolution of the criminal action filed against him in state court is DENIED. In this court's order of September 11, 2006, I concluded that plaintiff had failed to explain how he would be prejudiced by continuing this action while his state court action is pending. In the same order, I gave him until September 25, 2006, in which to file a response to plaintiff's motion for summary judgment. Subsequently, I extended claimant's deadline for opposing plaintiff's motion to October 27, 2006. Claimant has not responded to the motion. Instead, nearly two weeks after his deadline, he asks for a stay of these proceedings because he has successfully fired his state court attorney and has hired a new attorney who needs to "get[] his feet on the ground." The fact that claimant has fired one lawyer and hired another in his state court action does not change the fact that he has failed to show how he would be prejudiced if this case is not stayed.
