On July 8, 2005 this court released defendant Timothy Schumann on conditions, including one that prohibited alcohol consumption and another that required him to be monitored by Lisa Richards as a third-party custodian. Schumann continued to drink, he

lied about it to the pretrial services office and he intimidated Richards into not reporting

him as she had promised the court she would do. As a result, on October 25, 2005, the

government moved to revoke Schumann's pretrial release pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 3148.

At the October 26, 2005 motion hearing, I concluded that there is clear and convincing evidence that Schumann violated his release conditions and that this court cannot trust him to abide by any release conditions, even if modified as he proposed. This makes him a danger to the community.

Accordingly, It is ORDERED that defendant Timothy Schumann is committed to the custody of the United States Marshals Service for confinement at a proximate county jail separate from persons awaiting or serving sentences or being held in custody pending appeal. The defendant shall be afforded a reasonable opportunity for private consultation with his attorney. On order of this court or on request of an attorney for the Government, the jail shall deliver the defendant to the Marshals Service for the purpose of an appearance in this case.
