ORDER

A hearing was held on August 15, 2005, before United States District Judge Barbara B. Crabb to consider whether defendant Jeffrey J. Miller's pretrial release should be revoked on the ground that he had provided false information regarding his assets. The government appeared by Elizabeth Altman. Defendant was present in person and by counsel, Howard Goldman. United States Probation Officer Tracy Russom was also present.

After hearing from defendant, I am not fully persuaded that he was appropriately candid and forthright in the matter of his \$80,000 stock certificate. However, I am persuaded that with additional restrictions, defendant will neither pose a flight risk or a danger to the community. Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED that defendant will remain on pretrial release subject to the conditions imposed on him by the United States Magistrate

Judge with two additional restrictions: 1) Defendant is to provide the pretrial services officer any and all requested financial information; and 2) Defendant is to refrain from depositing of, transferring or obtaining any property of any kind valued at more than \$150.00 without the prior approval of the supervising probation officer.

If defendant has questions about these restrictions or about his travel, he is to talk to his supervising probation officer.
