Petitioner requests leave to proceed in forma pauperis.
Attached to his affidavit of indigency is a proposed complaint.

Petitioner alleges that defendant Linda Losha, an employee of the Royal Credit Union, made a false complaint against him and cancelled his account. He claims she discriminated against him on the basis of his race.

To state a claim under 42 U.S.C. §1983 plaintiff must allege that a person acting under color of state law violated his constitutional rights. Plaintiff has not alleged that either of the defendants acted under color of state law. Accordingly, petitioner's request to proceed in forma pauperis will be dismissed and denied without prejudice.

Petitioner is advised that in any future proceedings in this matter he must offer argument not cumulative of that already provided to undermine this Court's conclusion that his claim must

be dismissed. See Newlin v. Helman, 123 F.3d 429, 433 (7th Cir. 1997).

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that petitioner's request to proceed in forma pauperis is DENIED and DISMISSED without prejudice.
