In an order entered in this case on November 7, 2006, I granted plaintiff leave to proceed against defendants Frank, Grams, Nickel, Salter, Casperson and Westfield on his claim that these defendants are violating his rights under RLUIPA and the First Amendment by prohibiting him from possessing prayer oil, prayer beads and a prayer rug. In that order, I told plaintiff that pursuant to an informal service agreement between the Attorney General and this court, copies of his complaint and this order would be sent to the Attorney General for service on the defendants.

Now plaintiff has written to request summons forms so that he can serve the

defendants with his complaint. Plaintiff's request is dated November 6, 2006, making it clear that it crossed in the mail with the court's November 7 order. Because this court's informal service agreement with the Attorney General's office makes it unnecessary for plaintiff to complete summons forms, his request for the forms is hereby DENIED.
