ORDER OF DETENTION  
PENDING TRIAL

Case No. 07-01M-X

On January 11, 2007, this court held a hearing pursuant to 18 U.S.C. §3142(f) on the government's motion to detain defendant Lenard Rogers in this felon-with-ammunition case. The evidence and proffers establish while defendant is serving his term of probation imposed by the state of Illinois, he has been traveling between Chicago and Madison and staying here without his probation officer's knowledge or permission. During this time defendant, who apparently has a felony gun conviction in Chicago, possessed a box of .44 magnum ammunition that he was trying to sell for someone else. Following his arrest, defendant admitted to police that for the past few months he has been selling crack in Madison, with up to five customers per day buying one or two-gram quantities. Defendant's flouting of his current probation conditions establishes that he is a danger to the community and that he cannot be trusted to comply with any conditions of release.

It is ORDERED that defendant is committed to the custody of the United States Marshals Service for confinement at a proximate jail separate from persons awaiting or serving sentences or being held in custody pending appeal. The defendant shall be afforded a reasonable opportunity for private consultation with his attorney. On order of the court or on request of an attorney for the Government, the jail shall deliver the defendant to the Marshals Service for the purpose of an appearance in this case.
