ORDER OF DETENTION

07-CR-137-C

On November 21, 2007, this court held a hearing pursuant to 18 U.S.C. §3142(f) on the government's motion to detain defendant Kordarow Moore in this felon-with-a-gun case. After watching the police video of the traffic stop, then hearing proffers and arguments from both sides, I detained defendant, finding that the government had proved by clear and convincing evidence that he is a danger to the community. After defendant pled guilty in state court to a felony crack cocaine charge, the court released him on bond. While on bond, defendant was questioned by police during a traffic stop; he attempted to flee, struggled violently to resist arrest, and was found to have a loaded 9 mm. handgun tucked into the waistband of his pants. Having flouted the state court's release order by arming himself after a drug conviction, defendant has proved himself to be dangerous, untrustworthy, and incapable of complying with conditions of release.

It is ORDERED that defendant is committed to the custody of the United States Marshals Service for confinement at a proximate jail separate from persons awaiting or serving sentences or being held in custody pending appeal. The defendant shall be afforded a reasonable opportunity for private consultation with his attorney. On order of the court or on request of an attorney for the Government, the jail shall deliver the defendant to the Marshals Service for the purpose of an appearance in this case.
