ORDER OF DETENTION
PENDING TRIAL

07-cr-166-bbc

At the April 9, 2008 arraignment the government moved pursuant to 18 U.S.C. §3142(f) to detain defendant Mateo Morales pending his trial in this prison contraband case arising out of FCI Oxford. Because defendant already is in federal custody, he does not wish to contest the government's motion at this time but he has reserved his right to a substantive release hearing in the future. Based on this and based on the currently unchallenged facts set forth in case file and the pretrial service report, I find that the defendant is a danger to the community.

It is ORDERED that the defendant is committed to the custody of the United States Marshals Service for confinement at a proximate secure facility. The defendant shall be afforded a reasonable opportunity for private consultation with his attorney. On order of this court or on request of an attorney for the Government, the facility shall deliver the defendant to the Marshals Service for the purpose of an appearance in this case.
