MEMORANDUM

Plaintiff Mark Woodard brought this suit against the U.S. Treasury, alleging that it has been garnishing money from his Social Security income even though it is likely that he “owes no [2007] tax due to circumstances that again the IRS refuses to respond to.” The action was dismissed for lack of jurisdiction in a May 9, 2011 order.

Now plaintiff has submitted a document stating that he never received defendant U.S. Treasury’s motion to dismiss. I will attach copies of that motion and supporting materials to this memorandum. The case will remain closed, however, because plaintiff provides no argument for why the court’s reasoning in the May 9 order was incorrect. If plaintiff believes that the court erred in dismissing the case, he should file a motion for reconsideration and explain the legal basis for vacating that decision.
