In an order entered in this case on June 24, 2010, I gave petitioner until July 5, 2010 in which to explain why he believes he is entitled to relief under 28 U.S.C. § 2241 instead of 28 U.S.C. § 2255 on his claim that his conviction is illegal. Now, petitioner has filed a motion for an extension of time in which to make this showing. I will grant petitioner's motion and allow him a short extension in which to file his supplement.

In his motion, petitioner asks for an extension of the July 5 deadline because he did not receive the court order until June 29 and he would like more time to talk with a legal student that is assisting petitioner with his filings. Because petitioner's deadline has already passed and it may be beneficial for petitioner to consult with a legal student, I will grant him

a two-week extension until July 22, 2010, in which to file a supplement to the petition.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that petitioner James Frazier is GRANTED an extension of time to July 22, 2010, in which to file a supplement to his petition explaining why he believes he is entitled to relief under 28 U.S.C. § 2241 instead of 28 U.S.C. § 2255. If, by July 22, 2010, petitioner fails to respond to the June 24, 2010 order, I will dismiss his petition for his failure to show that he is entitled to relief under 28 U.S.C. § 2241.
