In an order entered in this case on July 27, 2010, I gave petitioner until August 9, 2010 in which to explain why he believes he is entitled to relief under 28 U.S.C. § 2241 instead of 28 U.S.C. § 2255 on his claim that his conviction is illegal. Now, petitioner has filed a motion for an extension of 60 days' time in which to make this showing. I will grant petitioner's motion in part and allow him an additional two weeks in which to file his amended petition.

In his motion, petitioner appears to be asking for an extension of the August 9 deadline because he is waiting to receive some additional paperwork from the sentencing court. Because this information may be helpful to petitioner, I will grant him a two-week extension until August 25, 2010, in which to file his amended petition.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that petitioner James Jackson is GRANTED an extension of time to August 25, 2010, in which to file a supplement to his petition explaining why he believes he is entitled to relief under 28 U.S.C. § 2241 instead of 28 U.S.C. § 2255. If, by August 25, 2010, petitioner fails to respond to the July 27, 2010 order, I will dismiss his petition for his failure to show that he is entitled to relief under 28 U.S.C. § 2241.
