Based upon the stipulation entered into by the parties, IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. Not later than May 23, 2011, the Prudential Insurance Company of America ("Prudential") shall pay the death benefit proceeds in connection with Individual Life Insurance Policy number R3111161 (the "Policy") insuring the life of Irene Zmrazek (the "Death Benefit") to the Rusk County Probate Court pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 854.23(4), which shall hold the Death Benefit until the probate judge determines the appropriate disbursements of the funds;
- 2. Upon deposit of the Death Benefit with the Rusk County Probate Court, Prudential shall be discharged from any and all liability to Steve Zmrazek, Kathy Patterson, as Power of Attorney for Steve Zmrazek, Laurie J. Neverman, Individually and as Mother and Natural Guardian of Duncan A. Neverman, a Minor, and August W. Neverman, a Minor, Michael G. Poplawski, Individually and as Father and Natural Guardian of Serah R. Poplawski, a Minor, and Rebekah A. Poplawski, a Minor, Lois A. Jacobsen, Mary K. McGraw, Kira M. Neuman, Richard T. Poplawski, Tyler D. Webb, Crystal S. Iveland, William D. Rebak, Edwin A. Rebak, and Joseph John Poplawski (collectively, the "Adverse Claimants") relating to the Policy and/or Death

Benefit, and for the Adverse Claimants to be, and hereby are, permanently enjoined from making any further actual or implied claims, demands and causes of action, asserted or unasserted, liquidated or unliquidated, arising out of or in connection with Prudential relating to the Policy and/or the Death Benefit due thereunder.

3. Upon notice from Prudential that it has deposited the Death Benefit as directed by this order, this civil action shall be dismissed with prejudice and without costs, and the Clerk of Court is directed to enter judgment closing the case.
