ORDER

In the proposed complaint filed in this case, plaintiff Michael B. Kingsley contended that defendants Robert Conroy, Stan Hendrickson, Nate White, the Monroe County Sheriff's Department and the Wisconsin Department of Corrections violated his rights under the Constitution and state law by failing to protect him from injury caused by inadequate lighting in the showers at the Monroe County jail. On July 16, 2012, I dismissed the complaint for failure to state a claim upon which relief may be granted, concluding that plaintiff's allegations were not sufficient to show that he faced a substantial risk of serious harm from the slippery floors and inadequate lighting at the jail.

Now before the court is plaintiff's motion for reconsideration of the dismissal. Dkt. #14. Plaintiff alleges no new facts suggesting that he faced a substantial risk of serious harm and makes no new arguments in support of his claim. Therefore, I am denying the motion.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that plaintiff Michael B. Kingsley's motion for reconsideration, dkt.  
#14, is DENIED.
