State inmate Jeffrey M. Davis, Jr., filed this civil action pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 1983, concerning the conditions of his confinement at the Columbia Correctional Institution and he is now represented by *pro bono* counsel in this matter. The parties have submitted a joint stipulation agreeing that the claims against defendants Tracy Zutz, Alicia Hans and Kirk Ratchman may be dismissed with prejudice. (Dkt. # 180). The parties also stipulate to the dismissal with prejudice of the following claims: (1) that defendant Jennifer Lemke ignored his threats of self-harm and other signs of his intent to attempt suicide on January 5, 2012; and (2) that defendant Elizabeth Barker failed to get Davis immediate medical attention following his suicide attempt on the night of February 27, 2012, and the early morning hours of February 28, 2012. All other claims against Lemke and Barker, which are described in the court's screening order (dkt. # 9), will remain pending in this lawsuit.

ORDER

Pursuant to the parties' joint stipulation (dkt. # 180), IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Plaintiff Jeffrey M. Davis Jr.'s claims against defendants Tracy Zutz, Alicia Hans and Kirk Ratchman are DISMISSED with prejudice.

2. Plaintiff's claim that defendant Jennifer Lemke ignored his threats of self-harm and other signs of his intent to attempt suicide on January 5, 2012 is DISMISSED with prejudice.
3. Plaintiff's claim that defendant Elizabeth Barker failed to get Davis immediate medical attention following his suicide attempt on the night of February 27, 2012, and the early morning hours of February 28, 2012, is DISMISSED with prejudice.
