ORDER

On August 4, 2014, defendant Ernest Kwasi Bankas filed a motion for post conviction relief under 28 U.S.C. § 2255 in which he alleged that his Fifth Amendment rights to due process under the United States Constitution and under Article 15, Rule of Speciality of the bilateral extradition treaty between the United States and the Netherlands were violated when he was extradited here from the Netherlands. On August 6, 2014, his motion was denied as untimely because it was not filed within the one year period from the date on which defendant's judgment of conviction became final.

Now defendant was filed several documents in which he continues to attack his conviction as illegal. As I explained in the August 6, 2014 order, this court has no

jurisdiction to hear defendant's motion because it was not filed within the one year period from the date on which defendant's judgment of conviction became final.

ORDER

Defendant's motion for clarification of the court's August 6, 2014 is construed as a motion for post conviction relief under 28 U.S.C. § 2255 and is DENIED for lack of jurisdiction.
