This case is set for a jury trial commencing April 4, 2016. In light of the pending motions for summary judgment and to accommodate the court's schedule, the court modifies the pre-trial schedule as follows:

- Rule 26(a)(3) disclosures and motions in limine are now due: March 4, 2016;<sup>1</sup>
- Responses are now due: March 15, 2016;
- *Contested* exhibits either in hard copies in binders or on a disc or thumb drive are now due: noon on March 23, 2016;
- The parties may bring hard copies or a disc or thumb drive of depositions to be used at trial to the final pretrial conference; and
- Final pretrial conference will now take place on March 25, 2016, at 10:00 a.m.

In addition to these changes to the schedule, the court will modify the procedure for submitting deposition designations in light of the significant number of depositions

filed in this case and the anticipated (though not encouraged) voluminous designations by both sides.

- As described in the court's the procedures governing final pretrial submissions and conference, deposition designations are now due on March 4, 2016, and objections and counter-designations are now due on March 15, 2016. In addition, any objections to counter-designations are due March 18, 2016.
- By Monday, March 21, 2016, the parties shall meet and confer on all depositions designations to determine whether any further resolutions can be achieved as to objections.
- By Wednesday, March 23, 2016, the party maintaining objections to designations shall file a brief in support of those objections, explaining the basis, and organizing the brief by deponent (though the parties are free to simply cross-reference arguments if they apply to multiple deponents). If the objections turn on a motion in limine, the party should so indicate.
- By Monday, March 28, 2016, briefs responding to the objections to deposition testimony are due.
- Also by Monday, March 28, 2016, the parties should file a list of the deponents roughly in the order that the parties intend to offer the testimony to the jury and the anticipated, estimated date by which that testimony is expected to be offered.
- The court then will issue orders on the deposition designation objections on a rolling basis, at least two days prior to the date by which the party intends to offer the testimony into evidence.
