ORDER

15-cv-430-bbc

Pro se plaintiff Phillip Dunn is alleging that several police officers violated his rights under the Fourth Amendment on two occasions, once by searching his home without adequate justification and in an unreasonable manner, and once by seizing him without adequate justification. Now plaintiff has filed a “motion to reschedule trial and extend motion deadlines,” in which he asks the court to stay the case for three to six months. Dkt. #27.

The only reason plaintiff gives for the stay is that he is incarcerated. However, he does not identify any specific ways that his incarceration is preventing him from litigating this case. As I told plaintiff the first time he asked for a stay because of his incarceration, many pro se parties litigate cases while they are incarcerated. Because plaintiff has not shown that he is unable to do the same, I am denying his motion.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that plaintiff Phillip Dunn's "motion to reschedule trial and extend motion deadlines," dkt. #27, is DENIED.
