Judgment was entered in this case on August 30, 2002, after I held in an order dated August 28, 2002, that the Religious Land Use and Institutionalized Persons Act is constitutional and that under the Act plaintiff is entitled to possess a reasonable quantity of prayer oil in connection with his religious practice. Presently before the court is plaintiff's "Motion for Costs and Fees" pursuant to Fed. R. Civ. P. 54.
