Judgment was entered in this action on March 24, 2006, following a grant of defendants' motion for summary judgment. Now plaintiff has filed a notice of appeal postmarked April 21, 2006. Because plaintiff is a prisoner, he is subject to the 1996 Prison Litigation Reform Act. This means that I must determine whether his appeal is barred because he has three strikes against him under 28 U.S.C. § 1915(g) or whether it must be certified as not having been taken in good faith. Plaintiff does not have three strikes against him, and I do not intend to certify that his appeal is not taken in good faith.

The 1996 Prison Litigation Reform Act requires also that plaintiff pay the \$455 fee for filing his notice of appeal, beginning with an initial partial payment that has been calculated from a certified copy of his trust fund account statement for the six-month period immediately preceding the filing of his notice of appeal. 28 U.S.C. § 1915(a)(2). Plaintiff has submitted the necessary trust fund account statement. From the statement, I conclude that he qualifies for indigent status, and that he must pay an initial partial payment to the clerk of this court in the amount of \$5.54.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that plaintiff James Kaufman's request for leave to proceed <u>in forma</u> <u>pauperis</u> on appeal is GRANTED on the condition that on or before May 18, 2006, he submits a check or money order made payable to the Clerk of Court in the amount of \$5.54 as an initial partial payment of the fee for filing his appeal. The remainder of the \$455 fee must be paid in monthly installments according to 28 U.S.C. § 1915(b)(2).

If, by May 18, 2006, plaintiff fails to pay the initial partial payment, I will notify the

court of appeals so that it may take whatever action it deems appropriate with respect to this appeal.
