Plaintiff's motion for reconsideration of this court's order of August 26, 2003, denying as premature his motion for witnesses at trial is DENIED. If the case survives a motion for summary judgment, plaintiff is free at that time to renew his motion. Contrary to plaintiff's belief that he will have to refile his list of witnesses, he may simply refer the court to the earlier filed motion (Dkt. #49) for the names of the persons he wishes present at trial.

In the past, I have tolerated abusive language in plaintiff's filings. However, plaintiff's latest submission reveals a highly disrespectful tone and a significant escalation in plaintiff's use of vulgar language. Although I can understand that plaintiff is disappointed and

frustrated by some of the rulings in his case, this court nevertheless expects the parties to comport themselves with dignity and to be respectful in their communications with the opposing parties and the court. In the future, I will disregard any communication plaintiff files with the court in which he uses belligerent vulgarities to describe actions taken by the court or opposing counsel.
