Plaintiffs, inmates at the Wisconsin Secure Program Facility in Boscobel, Wisconsin, have filed a complaint in this court. Plaintiff Algenone Williams has paid the \$150 filing fee.

In <u>Lindell v. Litscher</u>, 212 F. Supp.2d 936 (W.D. Wis. 2002), I ruled that I would no longer allow prisoners proceeding pro se to prosecute a group complaint in this court because of the many problems inherent in administering such cases. In this case, inmate Williams paid the filing fee. Therefore, it would be improper to dismiss the complaint as to

him without screening the merits of the complaint under 28 U.S.C. § 1915A. However, I will dismiss plaintiffs Courtney Felders, Cristopher Kopaczewski and Gustavo Rojel from the case, without prejudice to each of these inmates filing their own separate lawsuit setting forth the facts as they relate to him and listing the relief he seeks. If any one of plaintiffs Felders, Kopaczewski or Rojel does not have enough money in his prison account to pay the \$150 filing fee for filing his complaint, he may request pauper status and support his request with a trust fund account statement for the six-month period immediately preceding the filing of his complaint.

As noted above, with respect to plaintiff Algenone Williams, he may not proceed with this action until the court screens his complaint pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1915A. As soon as the screening process has been completed, plaintiff will be notified promptly. Until he learns whether he will be allowed to proceed and if so, against whom, plaintiff Williams is not to serve his complaint on the defendants.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that plaintiffs Courtney Felders, Cristopher Kopaczewski and Gustavo Rojel are DISMISSED from this case, without prejudice to their filing their own

separate lawsuits.
