In response to District Judge Barbara Crabb's order of January 5, 2004, petitioner Gregory McGee has submitted a revised affidavit of indigency and a copy of his right-to-sue letter from the Equal Employment Opportunities Commission. From the affidavit of indigency, I am satisfied that petitioner qualifies financially for indigent status. In addition, his submission of a right-to-sue letter satisfies the requirement that he have such a letter before filing his lawsuit in federal court. Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED that petitioner is GRANTED leave to proceed in this action in forma pauperis.

• For the remainder of this lawsuit, petitioner must send respondent a copy of every paper or document that he files with the court. Once petitioner has learned what lawyer will be representing respondent, he should serve the lawyer directly rather than

respondent. The court will disregard any documents submitted by petitioner unless

petitioner shows on the court's copy that he has sent a copy to respondent or to

respondent's attorney.

Petitioner should keep a copy of all documents for his own files. If petitioner does

not have access to a photocopy machine, he may send out identical handwritten or

typed copies of his documents.

• The United States Marshal will serve petitioner's complaint on respondent and

respondent will have 20 days from the date of service of the complaint upon it in

which to mail a responsive pleading to petitioner and file it with the court. Shortly

thereafter, the court will schedule a telephonic preliminary pretrial conference at

which deadlines for bringing this case to resolution will be set and at which petitioner

may ask any questions he might have about this court's procedures.
