Elva L. Velazquez has filed a complaint in this court in which she claims that she twice signed contracts under which she agreed to purchase pots and pans from Hy Cite Corporation, a Wisconsin corporation, that she never received. She seeks damages in the amount of \$4,000.

Generally, federal courts have the power to hear two types of cases: (1) cases in which a plaintiff alleges a violation of his or her constitutional rights or rights established under federal law and (2) cases in which a citizen of one state alleges a violation of his or her rights established under state law by a citizen of another state and the amount in controversy exceeds \$75,000. See 28 U.S.C. § 1331-32; see also Wild v. Subscription Plus, Inc., 292 F.3d 526 (7th Cir. 2002) (court has independent obligation to insure jurisdiction exists).

Plaintiff's claim of breach of contract is a state law claim. It must be brought in state court unless the parties are diverse and the amount in controversy exceeds \$75,000. In this case, the parties are not diverse and even if they are, the amount in controversy falls far short

Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED that plaintiff's lawsuit is DISMISSED for lack of subject matter jurisdiction.
