On November 10, 2005, this court held a telephonic status conference. Defendant Wilson Vargas did not participate personally but was represented by his attorney, Michael Lieberman. The government was represented by Assistant United States Attorney Grant Johnson.

Attorney Lieberman advised that Vargas no longer seeks an identity hearing, but would prefer to transfer jurisdiction of the alleged violation to this district for resolution. The government does not oppose this. Accordingly, there is nothing for the court to do now except wait for the parties to prepare, execute and file their documents pursuant to F.R.Crim. Pro. 20, after which the case will be assigned to a district judge for further proceedings under Rule 32.1(b). Defendant shall remain detained pending further proceedings.

This would follow as a matter of course by virtue of felony warrants out of New York state that currently serve as a detainer on defendant. Attorney Lieberman is aware of these warrants and will be exploring their impact on his client; they have no direct bearing on

proceedings in this court.

The parties had no other matters to bring to the court's attention.
