On March 16, 2006, counsel for defendants submitted a letter explaining the circumstances surrounding plaintiff's last motion for discovery and production of documents. *See* Dkt. 18. It appears that plaintiff has been playing both ends against the middle, submitting one document to the court and a different document to the defendants; this not only violates the rules set forth in the pretrial conference order, it is evidence that plaintiff is trying to perpetrate a fraud upon the court.
