On February 13, 2012, defendant filed a motion for modification of sentence under 18 U.S.C. § 3582. The government objected to the motion on the ground that it was a duplicate of a motion defendant filed in November 2011 in which his sentence was reduced from 360 to 292 months and defendant had received all of the relief to which he was entitled. On August 8, 2012, the court entered an order denying defendant's motion.

Now defendant has filed a brief in reply to the government's response. Nothing in

defendant's brief convinces me that was error to deny his motion. As I explained in the August 8, 2012 order, defendant did not qualify for any reduction in his sentence under Amendment 706 to the Sentencing Guidelines.
