On March 26, 2007 this court held a telephonic hearing on Lands' End's "Emergency Motion for Extension." Both sides were represented by counsel. In discussion with the parties, I granted the motion in part and denied it in part and gave the parties some additional breathing room in the calendar to attempt to accommodate each other.

First and most importantly, the summary judgment motion deadline is kicked back to April 16, 2007. This is the only extension available on the calendar, so no further extensions will be countenanced. Second, I ordered Versata to disclose Joshua Koppelman's functionality analysis not later than March 28, 2007. (I also ordered Lands' End to pay 50% of the cost of Koppelman's analysis, to the extent that a valid price can be placed on it.) Further, I extended Lands' End's deadline to provide its expert report(s) pending the parties' discussion on how to use the time between now and April 16, 2007. The parties predict they will be able to work out acceptable deadlines for tasks that need to be completed by then. In the event they need further

court intervention, they promptly should seek a telephonic hearing with the court. The parties had no other matters to bring to the court's attention.
