On June 29, 2006, plaintiffs, by counsel, filed a complaint for a writ of mandamus. On July 13, 2006, plaintiffs, pro se, filed a letter advising the court that they wished to withdraw their complaint and dismiss this lawsuit. At an August 17, 2006 telephonic conference, the attorney who originally had filed the complaint advised the court that he no

longer represented the plaintiffs and that they had confirmed to him on August 16, 2006 their wish to dismiss this case. Defendants, who were appearing specially because they have not yet been served, took no position on this matter.

Therefore, IT IS ORDERED that plaintiffs' motion is GRANTED and this case is DISMISSED WITHOUT PREJUDICE. The clerk of court is directed to enter judgment closing this case.
