Plaintiff Johnson Greybuffalo is proceeding in this action on his claim that defendants violated his right to free speech by confiscating documents and disciplining him because the documents contained references to the American Indian Movement and the Warrior Society. In an order dated November 17, 2006, I directed plaintiff to serve defendants with his

complaint. I provided him with a memorandum describing the procedure for serving individuals in a federal lawsuit, extra copies of his complaint and the forms necessary for obtaining from defendants a waiver of service of a summons. Now plaintiff has written to ask that he be sent five blank summons forms. The request will be denied as premature.

The service procedure plaintiff is to follow is described in the memorandum sent to him (another copy of which is enclosed to plaintiff with this order) and Fed. R. Civ. P. 4. Before he incurs the expense of serving a summons and complaint on the defendants, plaintiff is to utilize the procedure set out in Fed. R. Civ. P. 4(d) and the court's memorandum for notifying the defendants of the commencement of his action and requesting that the defendants waive service of a summons. If plaintiff follows that procedure and defendants fail to sign the waiver, he may so advise the court and I will send him blank summons forms.

#### ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that plaintiff's request for issuance of five blank summons forms

is DENIED as premature.
