This court held a telephonic preliminary pretrial conference on March 14, 2007. Plaintiff appeared by Amanda K. Gennerman. Defendants appeared by Richard D. Humphrey. The court set the schedule for this case and advised the parties that their conduct throughout this case is governed by this pretrial conference order and the attachments to it.

Plaintiff is seeking mandamus relief from the court. The parties agreed that this lawsuit can be decided on a motion for summary judgment. Therefore, plaintiff may have until May 14, 2007 within which to file and serve his motion for summary judgment; the government has 21 days after service of the motion within which to file and serve its response, and plaintiff has ten calendar days after service of the response within which to file and serve his reply. A party is not

entitled to additional time under Rule 6(a) or Rule 6(e) to file and serve documents related to a dispositive motion. The parties may not modify this schedule without leave of court.

Both sides must follow this court's procedure governing such motions, a copy of which is attached to this order. The court will not consider any document that does not comply with its summary judgment procedure. A party may not file more than one motion for summary judgment in this case without leave of court.

The parties may file documents with the court electronically. If they choose to file electronically, they must follow the court's procedures in order to ensure that the court properly receives and docket each submission. Parties in this lawsuit may receive court notices, briefing schedules and orders electronically. If they choose to participate in this program, they must follow the court's procedures.
