On July 23, 2007, this court held an impromptu telephonic status conference with Assistant United States Attorney Grant Johnson and Attorney Joseph Sommers on behalf of defendant Jared Molner. The impetus for this conference was a report from the U.S. Marshal's Service for this district that FMC-Butner again had attempted to return Molner to this district. Such a return would contravene the previous orders entered by this court. Indeed, the last this court was aware, as of May 18, 2007, FMC-Butner was engaged in a "dangerousness" determination pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 4246, which was being handled locally. Accordingly, there would be no reason whatsoever for FMC-Butner to return Molner to this district.

Neither of the attorneys had any additional information to provide. Indeed, both were as surprised as the court to hear of this attempted transfer. Assistant United States Attorney Johnson promised to contact the social worker and/or attorney at FMC-Butner with whom he previously has conversed about Molner to get updated information. Assistant United States

Attorney Johnson will report back to Attorney Sommers and this court; if necessary we will reconvene telephonically on the record to determine what needs to happen next.
