On June 9, 2006, this court held a recorded telephonic status conference at the request of counsel. Defendant Jeremy Deal did not participate personally but was represented by his attorney Michael Lieberman. The government was represented by Assistant United States Attorney Timothy O'Shea.

The parties indicated that they have reached a conditional resolution of this case that should obviate the need for a trial and any pretrial hearings. Deal has been convicted in state court and faces sentencing toward the end of June. In the event the state court sentences Deal to at least ten years in prison (plus some other conditions), the government will dismiss this federal case. Because both sides predict that this actually will happen, they volunteered to free up the court's calendar.

I accepted most of their offer: although we will keep the trial date in place for the time being, the pretrial motion hearing, final pretrial conference and final hearing all are stricken from the calendar. In the event of an unexpected state court sentence, we will reconvene

telephonically to reset these interstitial dates. The parties had no other matters to bring to the court's attention.
