Defendant Derrick Barber has filed an “Emergency Motion for Interruption of Sentence” to enable him to leave the Federal Correctional Camp at Oxford, Wisconsin, so that he can visit his terminally ill stepfather.

It is not clear to me that a court has authority to issue an order for interruption of sentence. If it does, I am not persuaded that this is a situation in which such an order should be issued.

Although I do not intend to grant defendant’s motion, I would have no objection if the Bureau of Prisons were to decide to grant him a short furlough for the purpose of visiting

his stepfather at this time.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that defendant Derrick Barber's emergency motion for interruption of his sentence is DENIED.
