The government's motion to modify this Court's October 17, 2006 detention order to allow the United States Marshal's Service to keep defendant Lowery at the JustCare facility came on to be heard before the Court in the above-entitled matter on October 23, 2006, the government having appeared by Erik C. Peterson, United States Attorney for the Western District of Wisconsin, by Stephen P. Sinnot and David Reinhard, Assistant United States Attorneys; defendant Robert Lowery appeared telephonically and by Charles W. Giesen in person. Honorable John C. Shabaz, District Judge, presided.

The Court determines from the medical records, testimony, comments of defendant and the entire file that the medical care and treatment provided by JustCare, Inc. is readily available to defendant, adequate and necessary to address his medical needs.
