Defendant Jeffrey Parker has filed a motion for early termination of his supervised release. His motion will be DENIED at this time.

Defendant began his 5-year term of supervised release on July 3, 2014. He obtained employment at Two Men and a Truck prior to his release from BOP custody while at Rock Valley Community Programs. At the present time, his living situation is not ideal. He has been staying at his sister's residence, his mother's residence, and his girlfriend's residence. His supervising probation officer is encouraging him to have more stability and independence so he can become more self-reliant. He is also participating in substance abuse counseling sessions twice a month.

Defendant is to be commended for the positive strides he has made over the past 15 months while on supervision. Defendant should continue to work with his supervising probation officer to sustain the positive momentum he has made. If defendant continues

to remain compliant with his conditions of release, I would be willing to consider a petition from the United States probation office for early termination after he has completed at least 31 months of supervised release.
