On December 13, 2006, this court held a telephonic pretrial motion hearing. Defendant Robert J. Paul did not participate personally, but was represented by his attorney Michael Lieberman. The government was represented by Assistant United States Attorney Peter Jarosz.

Prior to the hearing, Paul filed no pretrial motions. Attorney Lieberman stated that this was a tactical decision he made in consultation with Paul after adequate review of the government's disclosures and adequate investigation of this case. We then discussed discovery matters and seemed to reach a consensus on what remains to be done and when the information should be provided. Paul may have until December 20, 2006 within which to respond to the government's alibi demand, with any additional dates flowing from Rule 12.1. The government may have until January 2, 2007 within which to disclose expert witnesses, with reciprocal defense expert witness disclosure to occur by January 16, 2007.

Because this case likely will go to trial, I have included draft voir dire questions and jury instructions with this order.
