ORDER OF DETENTION
PENDING TRIAL

06-CR-200-C-2

At the January 4, 2007 arraignment the government moved pursuant to 18 U.S.C. §3142(f) to detain defendant Scott Eric Rosenstiel in this fraud case. The State of California has filed a detainer against defendant, so he is not contesting the detention at this time. Based on this, I conclude that defendant is a flight risk. Defendant may request a substantive release hearing if his circumstances change; it will be the government's burden to establish grounds for detention.

It is ORDERED that the defendant is committed to the custody of the United States Marshals Service for confinement at a proximate jail separate from persons awaiting or serving sentences or being held in custody pending appeal. The defendant shall be afforded a reasonable opportunity for private consultation with his attorney. On order of this court or on request of an attorney for the Government, the jail shall deliver the defendant to the Marshals Service for the purpose of an appearance in this case.
