Defendant Darrell Logan has filed a motion under 18 U.S.C. § 3582, seeking a modification of the 70-month sentence imposed upon him on June 5, 2008. This sentence was a reduction in his original 96-month sentence and was the result of a change in the sentencing guidelines to reduce the disparity in sentences for crimes involving crack and powder cocaine. Now defendant Logan has moved for another sentence reduction, this time under the Fair Sentencing Act, in which Congress reduced the sentences for crack cocaine offenders. Unfortunately for defendant, he is not eligible for any reduction under this statute because he was sentenced before the Act took effect on August 3, 2010. Dorsey v. United States, 132 S.Ct. 2321 (2012); U.S. v. Robinson, 697 Fd. 3d 443, 444-45. (7th Cir. 2012).

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that defendant Darrell Logan's motion for a sentence reduction pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 3582 is DENIED.
