ORDER

Defendant William D. Daniels has filed a motion for an extension of time in which to report for service of the sentence imposed upon him on November 23, 2010, after his supervised release was revoked. Defendant is to report for service of his sentence on January 4, 2011, but he says that he does not believe that this date gives him enough time to complete a case management system for a client and finish a website he is developing. In addition, defendant says that his fiancée is having a difficult pregnancy and may need his help before the baby is born in May and that he has an outstanding case in the Circuit Court for Dane County that he would like to resolve before he begins his revocation sentence.

Before I give any consideration to defendant's request, I will need to know the probation office's position on it. I will grant a temporary 10-day stay of the January 4, 2011

reporting date, or until January 14, 2011, to give defendant an opportunity to consult with his supervising probation officer. Defendant should be prepared to disclose to his probation officer all of the information that she needs to reach an informed decision on his request.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that defendant William D. Daniels's request for a stay is granted temporarily, until January 14, 2011 and he is directed to meet promptly with his supervising probation officer.
