ORDER OF DETENTION  
PENDING TRIAL

07-50-C

At the April 12, 2007 arraignment the government moved pursuant to 18 U.S.C. §3142(f) to detain defendant Vernail Brown pending further proceedings in this bank robbery prosecution. Defendant is in state custody so he is not contesting the government's motion at this time but he has reserved his right to a substantive, *de novo* release hearing if things change. Based on this, and based on the currently uncontested facts set forth in the pretrial service report, I find that the defendant is a flight risk and a danger to the community.

It is ORDERED that the defendant is committed to the custody of the United States Marshals Service for confinement at a proximate jail. The defendant shall be afforded a reasonable opportunity for private consultation with his attorney. On order of this court or on request of an attorney for the Government, the jail shall deliver the defendant to the Marshals Service for the purpose of an appearance in this case.
