PRETRIAL MOTION  
HEARING ORDER

07-CR-059-C

On July 11, 2007, this court held the pretrial motion hearing. Defendant Deonte Williams did not participate personally, but was represented by his attorney, Robert Ruth. The government was represented by Assistant United States Attorney Elizabeth Altman.

The telephonic hearing originally had been scheduled to discuss the government's opposition to Williams's request to take evidence on his motion to suppress. During the hearing, the parties agreed to accept the written reports of the agents as the factual record for the motion. Attorney Ruth further indicated that his motion, which he supported with case citations and arguments, constituted his brief in support. Accordingly, the government may file and serve its response by July 20, 2007, with any reply due by July 27, 2007. Same day service of both briefs is required.

The government provided a discovery proffer in response to Williams's two requests for discovery, neither of which required direct court action. The government must disclose

any expert witnesses not later than July 30, 2007, with reciprocal defense expert disclosures by August 13, 2007. The parties had no other matters to bring to the court's attention.
