SCHEDULING ORDER

07-cr-66-bbc-02

At an August 23, 2012 telephonic status conference with defendant Garry Milosevich's newly-appointed CJA attorney and the government, the court reset the schedule in this case as follows:

Pretrial motions and discovery requests: November 2, 2012

Pretrial motion hearing and any evidentiary hearing: November 9, 2012 at 9:00 a.m.

Deadlines to disclose expert witnesses: Government: already provided

Defendant: December 14, 2012

Submissions for the final pretrial conference: January 7, 2013

Final pretrial conference: January 10, 2013 at 9:00 a.m.

Final hearing: January 17, 2013 at 1:00 p.m.

Jury selection and trial: February 4, 2013 at 9:00 a.m.

The predicted trial length remains five to seven days. Because the government has alleged a multinational financial fraud scheme and has disclosed over 9000 pages of Rule 16 material, the speedy trial clock is tolled from Attorney Geier's appointment on August 7, 2012 until February 4, 2013 pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 3161(h)(7) in order to give defense counsel adequate time to review the government's disclosures, investigate this unusually complex case and prepare for trial, taking into account due diligence.
